Spalding Parish is participating in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) programme and, as such, we would like as many parents as possible to participate in this project.

The results of the parent carer survey will be coming directly to LPCF who will be responsible for analysing these results in order to provide feedback to the PINS project team. If you have been involved with LPCF before you will already know we are open to exploring various ideas to effectively capture the voices of parents and the school community.

Year 2:

In Year 2 we have been experiencing some wonderful hands on learning. This week we had Mr Mal in school leading an Indian Drumming Workshop, which the children really engaged with and thoroughly enjoyed. The day culminated in a brilliant performance to parents in Mr Mal also said the we were one of the best schools he had ever been to in his 56 years of doing these workshops!

In Science we have continued our investigations into the properties of materials. We have planned and ran an investigation into waterproofing, grouping and classifying materials based on their flexibility and whether they were plastic or not.

In Maths we have been exploring measurement. We have learnt that grams and kilograms are used to measure mass, reading scales to find the mass of objects. We have also learnt that length and height are measured in centimetres and metres, using rules and metres sticks to measure objects. Finally, we have looked at volume and capacity, comparing capacities of containers and the volumes in them.

In English we have been looking at the story 'Look Up' by Nathan Bryon and are beginning to plan a follow up to 'Look Up' that follows the main character Rocket's adventures thirty years later when she has become a fully trained astronaut. We are looking forward to finishing these plans and then writing up our stories. They will be amazing!

Year 4:

As part of RE studies about pilgrimage, Year 4 went to Walsingham shrine last week. They learned the history of how the site became a place of pilgrimage as well as what the early pilgrims would have worn and brought with them on their journey. Some of us were dressed up as medieval pilgrims! We also walked through the village to the Abbey, where we saw where the original Holy House had been. Finally, we lit a candle each in the new Holy House within the chapel.

We are taking part in Science Week, which is about Sustainability. Yesterday we did a survey all about our carbon footprint, where we discovered that our use of energy has an impact on the health of the world. We are looking forward to the rest of the week's activities!





We continue to enjoy our weekly visits to the swimming pool. Last week some of us swam 25 metres backstroke! Well done everyone!

Year 6:

Make £5 Grow aims to draw together the learning from Key Stage 2 in an entrepreneurial project. The children together have set up an Ice Lolly business and have used the knowledge and experience to set up their own Make £5 Grow businesses. They have carried out market research, visited places of work, interviewed industry experts, have put together and presented a business plan and now ultimately aim to make a profit. The project draws on their skills and subject knowledge from across the Key Stage Two Curriculum.



Last week, children from across Year 6 were given a place of work to visit in the local community. The businesses who supported our project brilliantly were: Springfields, Baytree, Coocumber, The Shoppe, Becca's lce-Cream Parlour and Rookes. Each group was given a unique insight into the World of Work, were able to explore how each business runs and ask a range of questions to support their next venture back in school. They were able to share their findings across the groups and use these to plan and pitch their own businesses to a panel including Mrs Mulley, Mrs Hill and industry experts from Springfields. Before the end of term, the children will run a career's fair for their parents and then will open their businesses for the rest of the school to enjoy. We look forward to seeing you there.
