As a school we are currently participating in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) programme, which aims to improve support for children with additional needs. As part of this partnership and to support the PINS project and introduce Lincolnshire Parent Carer Forum, the LPCF will be hosting a coffee afternoon at Spalding Parish on Thursday October 10th at 2pm. This event will be for all parent carers of children with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND); no diagnosis is required.

The children have settled well into their new Year One classes. We have been very busy already. revisiting our learning of place value up to 10 by using different resources to show the amount. In History we have begun our learning about significant people and are looking at the works of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. As part of this learning we have been using role play to to get a better understanding of all the things Florence Nightingale did to help make hospitals better. In English and Science we have been looking what makes us, us! We have learnt about our body parts and senses and we have begun to write letters to our Year Five walking buddies to tell them all about ourselves. We cannot wait to further our learning!

Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the new school year. Everyone has adjusted brilliantly to their new Key Stage and teachers. We have started an exciting new journey for our History lessons, learning all about prehistoric Britain in the Stone Age! The children had some brilliant ideas and predictions when shown some artefacts from the past and enjoyed discovering the roles of an archaeologist.

In English we started the year by writing a letter to our new Phase Leader to introduce ourselves. We have now started using Roald Dahl's George's Marvellous Medicine as a stimulus to write our own character descriptions. In Maths we have focused on Place Value and started to practise our multiplication tables. We have been focusing on 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s so please help us by testing us on these at home. We have had a fabulous first couple of weeks back at school with the pupils displaying such positive attitudes to learning and we are really looking forward to the rest of the term!

#### Year 5:

Welcome to Year 5 from Miss Wakefield, Miss Jina and Miss Arnold and the whole Year 5 team - we are looking forward to a fabulous year ahead and look forward to sharing much of our learning with you, through the Parish Post, through the website and also through social media. Please make sure you are regularly visiting all.

We've had a brilliant start to this academic year. Year 5 have been extremely busy with their learning over the last three weeks. In History and Reading we have been learning about The Battle of Hastings and the events that lead up to this. The children have taken part in reenactments, explored fictional stories from the perspective a young boy in 1066, and created storyboards mapping out the events that took place during the battle.

In English we have been writing letters using our class story, Matilda by Roald Dahl. We have explored the characters in the story: their appearance, character traits and emotions. We then explored the same topics about ourselves and have written letters to Miss Bird so she can get to know us a little better. We are looking forward to our next writing unit – character descriptions.
