### Dear Parent/Carer,

As you will know the areas around our school are extremely busy in the morning and often even more so at the end of the school day. Unfortunately, there have been an increasing number of parents who are parking far too close to these entrances or acting inconsiderately with their motor vehicles, placing children and adults in danger. We would like to remind you that that it is our collective responsibility to maintain a safe journey to school for everyone. We can do this in a number of ways. If you walk your child to school or indeed they walk or cycle on their own, please can I ask you to remind them about the importance of personal safety as they travel to and from school. We will also be reviewing with all pupils. **Road Safety Good Practice:** 

- Walk sensibly on all pavements, particularly where width has been restricted.
- When you need to cross a road always Stop, Look, Listen, Think.
- Only cross the road when it is free from traffic and is safe to cross.
- Concentrate fully when you are near busy roads.

If you do need to drive, please be considerate to others and ensure you follow these parking rules for collection and drop off:

- Cars must not be parked on the yellow zigzag "School Keep Clear" markings.
- Cars should not be parked on pathways during drop off and collection times.
- Please ensure you are travelling at low speed at all times around the school site.


