Dear Parent/Carer,

Parish Post Phase Update #proudtobeparish

EYFS:

Wow, what a fantastic fortnight we have had. We continue to be really proud of all of the children and how they have settled into school. They all know and understand the routines well and are all flourishing in terms of their learning and their learning behaviours. You would never know that they had only been with us for a matter of weeks. We hope they you are all very proud of them and how they have settled into school. We are so pleased they are all part of our Spalding Parish family and look forward to the year ahead and sharing further updates regarding their learning with you all.

Over the last fortnight we have focussed our learning on being inquisitive and exploring to extend our learning. As part of this we have been reading the story 'Pumpkin Soup' and then have been asking lots of different questions about pumpkins. To build on this we then used our artistic skills to draw pumpkins, using techniques such as stippling, cross hatching and blending to create different artistic effects. Whilst we perhaps were not sure what some of these techniques were when we started we all learnt very quickly and gave all the techniques a go with fantastic results.

Year 2:

We are continuing to enjoy our learning in Year Two. We have been introduced to our artist in focus, Andy Warhol and have looked at the style of his work. We are now practising some skills to make portraits in the style of Warhol.

We have just finished writing some character descriptions of Aunt Sponge and Aunt Spiker from 'James and the Giant Peach', choosing some interesting adjectives to describe them. We will now post a copy of these off to the Roald Dahl Museum so they can see how he has influenced our writing.

In RE we have been studying the events of Holy Week, leading up to Easter and have thought about how each of the events may make Christians feel. We also now have the script in for our Key stage 1 Christmas play. We are very excited as Year 2 take the speaking and acting parts in our Key Stage 1 Nativity and will therefore be sending scripts home with the children before half term for them to begin learning. We hope you will support them with this. After the break we will be starting to learn the songs, I'm sure you will know them as well as the children by the time of the performances!

Year 4:

The last fortnight in Year 4 we have been very busy! This included our first trip of the academic year as last Thursday we were very excited to go on our History trip to the Collection Museum in Lincoln. This allowed us to consolidate our Anglo-Saxon learning. We learnt a lot of new information about Lincoln during Anglo Saxon times as well as having the opportunity to do our own mini excavations and investigate artefacts from the time.

In Maths, we have just finished our place value unit and are now moving onto addition and subtraction, looking at the column method with numbers up to 4-digits. We will begin using the 'Build it' strategy for the physical numbers and then manipulate counters to compete the calculations. We are continuing to practise our Times Tables every week but please continue supporting us with this at home.

In Science we are looking at food chains and discovering how an animal's teeth affects what it eats. We are learning about how producers are always a type of plant, fruit or seed as they produce their own food. Prey then eats the producer and they can then be eaten by other animals known as predators. Sometimes they can be eaten by even bigger predators however we have also learnt that a top predator is not eaten by anything else and their only threat are humans. Ask us about it at home and we can share our learning with you!

Year 6:

Year 6 have had another very busy couple of weeks. All the Year 6 team are so impressed with the attitudes to learning of all the Year 6 pupils. It would be fair to say they have produced some brilliant work during Term 1 and it has been an absolutely brilliant start to the academic year. Well done all, and thank you!

English has seen us exploring the work of Benjamin Zephaniah, reading his poems and discussing the meanings. We found 'Dis Poetry' hard to read initially, but we persevered despite the challenges. This has been in readiness for us to write our own poems. In Maths we have been busy learning the long division method. Some of us found it tricky to start with, but the more we used the method, the more our confidence has grown. Using microbits was the focus of our Science lessons, including designing a step monitor or heart monitor that could be used in order to help keep our heart healthy. We also had the pleasure of watching the Rhubarb Theatre Company and their eco-friendly production. In a fun and inspiring way, they showed us how rubbish can affect habitats for different animals and what we can do to help stop it. This really supports our sustainability focus this year. We are looking forward to seeing what our last week of Term 1 brings.
